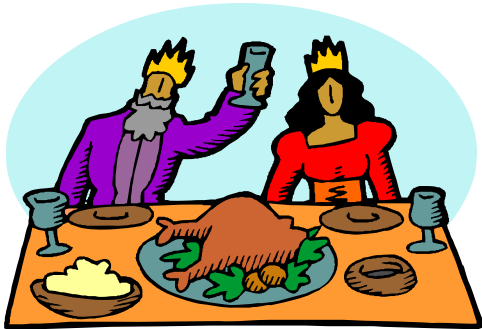

Exit I-95 at Yamato Road, go east to Federal Highway and turn right (south) onto Federal Highway. Turn right at N.E.

14th Street. The Center is 1/2 block west of Federal Highway on the right.

To get there from the south—

Exit I-95 at Glades Road and proceed east to Federal Highway. Go north on Federal Highway past Glades Road. At the first break in the median after Glades Road make a U turn to go back south. Turn right onto N.E. 14th Street. The Center is 1/2 block west of Federal Highway on the right.

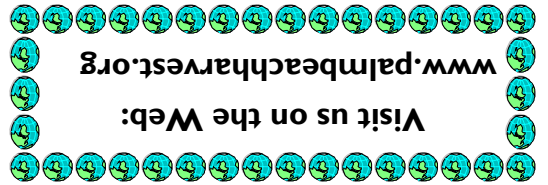
